We offer a comprehensive continuum of care and services, from homelessness prevention to permanent housing.

We are part of a network of services in Montgomery County designed to help people help themselves.

### prevention services

Assist low-income residents who are at risk of becoming homeless with flexible financial assistance and case management. Activities include deposit and/or first month's rent assistance, mediation for landlord tenant disputes, linkage to legal services, and referrals to community based programs.

### housing relocation

Assists individuals and families in locating, obtaining, and retaining suitable housing. Includes diversion, web-based housing locator service, housing search and placement assistance, leasehold education, mediation, and active outreach to property owners.

### outreach services

Outreach workers canvass the streets to build trust relationships with the hardest to serve street homeless by meeting basic needs and engaging them for further services. Serves as a point of contact for local citizens and businesses regarding homelessness.

### gateway case management

Comprehensive assessments and housing-focused case management to single adults and families with children currently residing in the emergency gateway shelters. Serves as front door to community housing programs.

### rapid rehousing

Successful model of scattered site supportive housing which combines short-term rental subsidies and home based case management services with linkage to community based services.

### transitional housing

Housing and appropriate supportive services to homeless veterans to facilitate movement to independent living within 24 months.

### supportive housing

Long term community based housing and supportive services to homeless persons with disabilities. Locations include River Commons, Kettering Commons, Iowa Avenue and Ohio Commons as well as scattered site private landlords.

### mental health services

Assists people who are experiencing mental health problems, especially persons who are chronically homeless. ODMH certified and CARF accredited for mental health case management and outpatient treatment for adults.

Through its partnerships with other public and private agencies, The Other Place is able to offer additional services to its clients including chemical dependency counseling and treatment, medical and psychiatric treatment, specialized employment services, GED and literacy linkage, assistance for veterans, legal assistance, credit counseling, and housing.

The most recent reports state that each year nearly 8,000 people experience homelessness in Dayton and Montgomery County.

To quote the Montgomery County Homeless Solutions Leadership, "Our community will be judged by how it treats its most vulnerable residents. The community cannot allow our citizens to live on the street or in shelters."
